

Treasurer's Report: 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 World Heritage UK is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and was registered with the Charity Commission (charity number 1163364) on 1 September 2015.
- 1.2 This report details the Income and Expenditure Account from 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020.
- 1.3 An Independent Examiner's report has been carried out by Andrew Chappell FCA MIMgt of Chappell Associates Ltd as required by the Charity Commission for those charities with gross incomes greater than £25,000 per annum.
- 2.0 Income and Expenditure Account from 1 April 2019 31 March 2020

Income

- 2.1 Income received between 1 April 2019 and 31 March 2020 was £50,748. This includes income from: membership subscriptions (£25,693), income from meetings (£4,772) and the annual conference (£13,020) held in The Llangollen Pavilion, home of the International Musical Eisteddfod Hall.
- 2.2 World Heritage UK received a total of £2,000 in meeting sponsorship from Purcell and Arcadis and generous support of Cadw with a grant of £3,980 towards the costs of the annual conference.
- 2.3 World Heritage UK received support towards the completion of the World Heritage UK Review from Historic England, Cadw and Historic Environment Scotland. The Trustees are very grateful to all our public and private sector supporters who enables us to carry out our work.
- 2.4 WH:UK maintained its individual membership with a small increase from 52 to 53 in 2019/20.
- 2.5 The Board is grateful for the in-kind support of Arup Ltd to enable the meetings of our Trustees in London during 2019/20.
- 2.6 The Board has retained a reserve of £10,000.

Expenditure

2.7 Expenditure for the financial period was £84,178 this is considerably more than in previous years and reflects two important pieces of work. Firstly, the completion of the important

Review of the UK's World Heritage Site Collection which was launched at the conference in October 2020. This was largely prepared by Chris Blandford our President and will form the focus of our advocacy work in 2020-21 and beyond. The second is the "Unlocking the Potential" project funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund Resilient Heritage Fund. This began in earnest when Tiva Montalbano took up her role as Project Manager in October 2019. This project is due to complete in March 2021.

Balance

- 2.8 At the end of the financial year 2019/20 WH:UK had £46,735 in net assets, £20,776 of which are restricted funds.
- 2.9 The Trustees' reserve policy is to maintain a minimum balance of £10,000 with the aim of building it to £15,000. This was agreed by the Board on 14 April 2016.

3.0 Covid 19

- 3.1 In common with all our members, our original plans for 2020 have been altered dramatically by the outbreak of Covid 19 and the global pandemic. All our events planned (spring meeting at Blenheim Palace. summer meeting in the Lake District and conference in Scotland) had to be postponed and our trustee meetings became virtual.
- 3.2 29% of our income is earned through WH:UK events and there was concern regarding the ability of some of our members to pay due to the effects of the pandemic. The Trustees have taken measures to reduce WH:UK's outgoings and protect its reserves so that it can respond positively to the needs of its members as we emerge from the current situation.
- 3.3 WH:UK's activities have become virtual with monthly forum's for World Heritage Site Coordinators using the Zoom platform. These have had the added bonus of enabling our overseas members to join us more easily. The Trustees continue to meet regularly and review the changing situation to ensure that it continues to support the needs of the membership.
