Treasurer's Report 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 World Heritage UK is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and was registered with the Charity Commission (charity number 1163364) on 1 September 2015.
- 1.2 This report details the Income and Expenditure Account from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021.
- 1.3 An Independent Examiner's report has been carried out by Andrew Chappell FCA MIMgt of Chappell Associates Ltd as required by the Charity Commission for those charities with gross incomes greater than £25,000 per annum.

2.0 Income and Expenditure Account from 1 April 2020 - 31 March 2021

Income

- 2.1 World Heritage UK is very grateful to its members for its continuing support despite the difficulties faced by many due to the impact of the coronavirus pandemic. Our membership income of £27,506 reflects a 100% renewal rate by our Voting and Associate Members. Our membership review in 2020/1 enabled us to focus on how best to continue to support our members as we emerge from the pandemic and ensure strong renewals in 2021/22.
- 2.2 World Heritage UK received the second half of its £100,000 grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) as part of its Resilient Heritage programme which started in October 2019 and was completed in March 2021.
- 2.3 World Heritage UK was fortunate to receive two grants from the covid response packages provided by the NLHF and the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). World Heritage UK received £23,300 from the Heritage Emergency Fund and £16,700 from the Cultural Recovery Fund. These met the shortfall caused by the lack of events in 2020/21 and enabled us to retain our staffing capacity and deliver an online programme. The grants also enabled us to make digital improvements such as a new website and the purchase of a Customer Relationship Management system which have helped to strengthen our organisation further and enable us to support our members as the sector recovers.
- 2.4 WH:UK maintained its individual membership with an increase from 53 to 60 in by the end of March 2021.

Expenditure

2.5 Expenditure for the financial period was £126,637 this is considerably more than in previous years and includes expenditure related to the grant income received in this year and mentioned above at section 2.2 and 2.3. Otherwise the Trustees have reduced their expenditure by moving all meetings online.

Balance

- 2.6 At the end of the financial year 2020/21 WH:UK held total funds of £29,080. Of this just £630 is restricted funds being an advance membership fee for 2022/23.
- 2.7 The Trustees' reserve policy has been to maintain a minimum balance of £10,000 with the aim of building it to £15,000. This was agreed by the Board on 14 April 2016. This has now

been achieved with a reserve of $\pm 15,000$ now held in our deposit account. This leaves approximately $\pm 14,000$ as working capital.

3.0 Covid 19

3.1 The Trustees reported last year that they had taken measures to reduce expenditure as a response to the effect of the coronavirus pandemic. The grants from NLHF and DCMS have been very welcome as they have enabled World Heritage UK to retain and expand its staffing capacity to deliver activity which strengthens the organisation and enables it to be able to handle the uncertainty of 2021-22 and beyond.
