Webinar: 'The Changing Nature of World Heritage Designed Landscapes', 12th May

World Heritage UK welcomes you to a guest lecture on 'The Changing Nature of World Heritage Designed Landscapes', by Dr David Jacques, with a Q&A session chaired by World Heritage UK Trustee, Stephen Ratcliffe, Director of Sustainable Development at the Lake District National Park Authority.

Dr David Jacques was Inspector of Historic Parks and Gardens at English Heritage and at other times ran MA courses at the University of York and the Architectural Association on landscape conservation. As a consultant he was involved in the restorations of the Privy Garden at Hampton Court and the Elizabethan Garden at Kenilworth Castle.

Stephen Ratcliffe is Director of Sustainable Development for the Lake District National Park Authority (LDNPA); and was instrumental in the establishment of the Lake District National Park Partnership (LDNPP). He chairs the English

LDNP and English Lake District WHS); a first for any National Park in the UK.
