Moravian Church Settlements nomination

The US National Park Service submitted that country's first transnational nomination to the World Heritage List for the first time in the World Heritage Convention's 50-year history. The nomination is for **Moravian Church**Settlements, which include the Historic Moravian Bethlehem District in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, historic settlements of Herrnhut in Germany, and

The Bethlehem World Heritage Commission collaborated with representatives of Herrnhut and Gracehill to join the Moravian settlement of <u>Christiansfeld</u> in Denmark, which has been on the World Heritage List since 2015, to form a single World Heritage listing for all the Moravian Church Settlements. The settlements illustrate the global dissemination of the Moravian Church's distinct religious and social ideals in the 18th century, which are expressed in the towns' plans and architecture with many buildings still used for their original purpose.

This nomination will be considered for inscription on the World Heritage List by the UNESCO World Heritage Committee in the summer of 2024.

Good luck to Gracehill and their partners! And of course, to the <u>Flow Country</u>, also being considered for inscription in 2024.



Impact Assessment in a World Heritage Context - online course

13th - 15th March 2023

World Heritage properties continue to face pressure from various forms of development – including commercial and residential projects, energy projects, transport infrastructure and tourism development – and other significant changes that can affect their Outstanding Universal Value. State of Conservation Reports often bring these issues to the attention of the World Heritage Committee, which has long requested impact assessments to inform better decision-making for the future of World Heritage. To respond to these Committee requests and comply with the Operational Guidelines for the

guidance and support to build capacities on impact assessment.

This **online course on Impact Assessment in a World Heritage context** will introduce participants to the methodology outlined in the updated <u>Guidance</u> and <u>Toolkit</u> for <u>Impact</u> <u>Assessment</u> in a <u>World</u> <u>Heritage</u> <u>context</u> (July 2022), which was prepared by the three Advisory Bodies to the World Heritage Convention – ICOMOS, ICCROM and IUCN – in partnership with the UNESCO World Heritage Centre. It explores how impact assessment and multidisciplinary cooperation can be useful in identifying solutions for both protecting World Heritage sites and supporting high-quality, appropriate development.

The World Heritage Leadership programme has launched a call for applications for the online course "Impact Assessment in a World Heritage context" which will be held **online in March 2023**. 
Durham WHS Job Opportunity
